1. A separate form is needed for each Camp Helper (it may be photocopied).
2. A non-returnable deposit of £5 is required (please enclose a s.a.e. if you require a receipt).
3. To enable the processes involved in C.R.B. Disclosures to go ahead in time, you need to return the application form before 15th April. Accepting applications from children who wish to come to camp will depend on how many staff we have.
4. We reserve the right to cancel camp if the number of applicants is too small to make camp viable. In that case all moneys paid will then be refunded.

You are required to provide us with details of your previous experience of working with children and any criminal convictions, including any involving children. Also we need you to provide us with a current C.R.B. (Criminal Records Bureau) Enhanced Disclosure certificate. We can advise and help on this, so please ask about current procedures for obtaining an up-to-date form.

We camp under canvas on a purpose built site at Whitesmith, off the A22, near Chiddingly, East Sussex, and provide lively outdoor holidays with many different types of activities.



The range of activities varies from camp to camp but is carefully selected for the age group concerned.

Particular attention is paid to providing a balanced diet of nutritious food.



The on-site facilities include electric power, a permanent kitchen meeting today's high standards of hygiene, indoor toilets and hot & cold washing/showering facilities.



We have a Child Protection Policy in place, some details of which appear on page 6. Parents may ask to see a full copy of this policy before or on arrival at camp.



For the sweet toothed there is also a tuck shop on site.



Campers' pocket money can be safeguarded by use of the onsite banking facility, available to withdraw daily.
